

Description: A Line in the Sand Definition: " a point beyond which one will not go" The island of Andros is a pristine ecosystem, with the largest freshwater source in the Bahamas, massive mangrove shoreline, of the world's largest barrier reefs, and a legendary bonefish habitat. Now, a small group of anglers and activists are raising their voices in an effort to stop a 5,000-acre limestone mine threatening its future. DOMINICAN REPUBLIC REACHES THE PROTECTION OF 30% OF ITS WATERS


Description: On April 10, 2024, the government of Dominican Republic announced the creation of the new Orlando Jorge Mera marine sanctuary and the expansion of the Marine Mammal Sanctuary of Banco de la Plata & de la Navidad. With this announcement, the country increases the total protected area of its exclusive economic zone to 30%, making it the first nation in the Caribbean to achieve the 30x30 goal. Thanks to the bold leadership of the Dominican Republic, important species such as humpback whales, sperm whales, and dolphins that traverse this region will find refuge and be able to maintain balance in the productive ecosystems of our oceans.

THE FIRST CETACEAN RESEARCH EXPEDITION FOR THE ABC ISLANDS


Description: In October 2023, CCS conducted the first expedition of the Ti Whale An Nou program for Aruba, Curacao and Bonaire. This was the first time a standardized research protocol to monitor whales and dolphins was applied to the ABC islands. Thanks to the support of WWF-NL, this research expedition allowed us to monitor the species diversity, distribution and relative abundance in the waters of the ABC islands and create awareness for the need to expand the Yarari Sanctuary in Bonaire to Curacao and Aruba. EMERALD SANCTUARY


Description: Emerald Sanctuary investigates the central role of seagrass in the ecology and culture of coastal Florida through comparisons of two distinct coastal communities, revealing how seagrass' catastrophic decline, due to water pollution, is tied to our charismatic megafauna and much of Florida's way of life. Seagrasses are a lynchpin in the tapestry of our coasts, providing food and habitat for manatees, gamefish, and sea turtles, while keeping our water clean, inviting, and full of life. The film also reveals how some communities are restoring their seagrasses, breathing life into their waterways and providing hope for the future of Florida's coasts.
